Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Clark State College in order to transfer to Wright State. To be admitted into the Social Work Program at Wright State, students must earn a minimum 2.25 GPA from Clark State College.

Students must apply for admission to Wright State and the Social Work program by February 1 of the sophomore year/year two (while still studying at Clark State).

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*Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university <u>before</u> Social Work Program application can be approved.

Students must complete the following coursework at Clark State prior to being fully admitted to the Social Work program: BIO 1410, COM 1110, ECO 1100, ENG 1111, ENG 1112, PLS 1100, PSY 1111, SOC 1110, SWK 1100, and SWK 2230.

Students must earn a C or higher in ENG 1111, ENG 1112, SWK 1100, and SWK 2230 at Clark State.
